In the Optional 440 V8, Six Pack option 420 coupes were built, with 267 were Automatics and 153 had 4 Speed Transmissions.

1,487 were hardtops that broke down to 826 4 Speeds and 661 were automatics.

The Super Bee was offered in a 2 door Hardtop or Coupe form.

It was a crisply styled, luxurious high-speed machine. Base engine in this model was the 383 V8 which had a 4 speed Transmission or a Torque Flite Automatic coupled to 9 ¾ inch Dana 60 Sure Grip axle with 4.10:1 gears. Features included heavy-duty suspension, bucket seats, special identification and Dodges Bumblebee tail striping and power bulge hood. Buyers had their choice of eighteen exterior colors.

A two door hardtop joined the existing pillared coupe for 1969. The Super Bee also received a single wider rear bumble bee stripe and a Dodge "Scat Pack" badge on the grille and trunk, plus front fender engine callouts. Also new was a new Ramcharger cold-air induction system, which was standard on Hemi cars. The Ramcharger system featured two large hood scoops, an underhood air plenum and a switch to select between warm and cold air.

But the big news for 1969 was a new optional engine in the Super Bee. MOPAR engineers took the existing 440 cid V8 and replaced the single Carter four barrel carb with three Holley two-barrel carbs on an Edelbrock Hi-Riser manifold, creating the Dodge 440 Six Pack (Plymouth called it the 440+6). Only the center carb was used for normal driving, but slamming on the fun pedal opened all six carbs for a combined 1,375 cfm rush. Hemi valve springs, a hotter cam, Magnafluxed connecting rods, and other improvements helped boost output to 390 bhp.

A Hurst four speed manual transmission was standard. Torqueflite automatic was optional, but disc brakes, air conditioning, and cruise control were not allowed. The Super Bee Six Pack came with one of the wilder hoods in muscle doom. The lift off hood was made of fiberglass, had a matte black finish, four NASCAR tie down pins, and a large air scoop molded right in with "Six Pack" written on the sides. The all business look was completed with standard black steel wheels, unadorned except for chrome lug nuts. The 440 Six Pack cost \$463, about \$500 less than a Hemi. The Six Pack could keep up with a Hemi up to 70 mph and came with a Hemi grade suspension that turned the Super Bee into a decent handler.

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Color choice on the Six Pack Super Bee was limited to only six Hi-Impact colors which were Bright Red, Bright Green, Bright Yellow, Hemi Orange and in April, Bahama Yellow. 1969 1/2 Super Bees were all manufactured after April 26 1969.

Common trouble spots were the cooling, electrical, fuel and ignition systems. Availability of parts is good and investment potential is AA.

Of the 1969 Coronets, 87.7% were equipped with the automatic, 8.3% had the four speed manual, 4% had the three speed manual, 83.6% had power steering, 15.7% had power brakes, 3.2% had disc brakes, .5% had power windows, 63.9% had tinted glass and 39.5% were sold with air conditioning.

The 1969 Super Bees are on The Made in USA Certified Muscle Car list, compiled by Muscle Car Review, in July 1987.

On the Dodge Super Bee inspected, the restoration was started in 1996 and completed in October of 2004 with 0000 miles driven since.

The engine was rebuilt to stock specifications by Lee Brother's Performance in Red Deer, Alberta in November, 2000 with 00000 miles driven since.

At 3800 RPM the stroked 468 cid V8 engine should deliver 550 lbs of torque.

At 5200 rpm it can deliver 468.1 horsepower.

The heads were ported and polished.

Rebuilt carburetors were done by Harvey Pahl.

New gas tank installed.

Stock Edelbrock aluminum manifold with the optional decal Six Pack air cleaner filter assembly. Removable fiberglass scooped hood.

There is an under hood detailed, painted, show status appearance package as per enlarged color photographs.

The radiator was rebuilt.

Cooling hoses and drive belts are new with reproduction hose clamps.

Reproduction Mopar battery installed.

New reproduction battery cables are mounted.

Correct steel exhaust manifolds.

New exhaust system and exhaust tips are in place.

The transmission was rebuilt along with a new clutch and related components.

Dana 60 differential with a ratio of 4.10:1.

Major brake work was done.

Major suspension work was completed.

All tabs markings are applied.

Paint and bodywork was complete in October 2001 by Joey's Place in Edmonton, Alberta.

This was a professional quality body shop project.

Body shop was utilized for the removal and installation of bumpers, fenders, moldings and



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exterior and interior components.

Vehicle was disassembled for proper restoration procedures.

This was a frame off restoration, the way it should be done.

Vehicle was put on a rotisserie.

Frame and chassis were sandblasted, painted and detailed.

Body was beads blasted as required.

There was the installation of replacement right fender a number of years ago.

Good straight body for its year.

New chrome wheel moldings.

Rubber weather stripping on are the doors are new.

Window channel sweepers, felts and rubbers installed are new.

New reproduction interior supplied from Year One.

No steering wheel cracks.

Vehicle has been in extended periods of indoor storage.

Good pristine units like the one appraised are hard to find.

There is a very large display of literature, manuals, past owner documentation as per photos.

This Super Bee has a strong performance stock car buff following and is priced accordingly to condition and collector status.

Muscle cars were dressed up with big wheels and tires, air scoops, spoilers, stripes and decals. What really made muscle cars different, was what was under the hood and a few of them had the strongest, toughest and most powerful engines around. This vehicle is without a doubt in this class league.
