- A TELEGRAM FROM CHEVROLET MOTOR DIVISION DISTRIBUTION APOLOGIZING FOR THE DELAY IN BUILDING THE CARS DUE TO SUPPLIER STRIKES.
- A LETTER VERIFYING THE ORDER NUMBERS, VINS, AND BUILD DATES FOR BOTH CARS.
